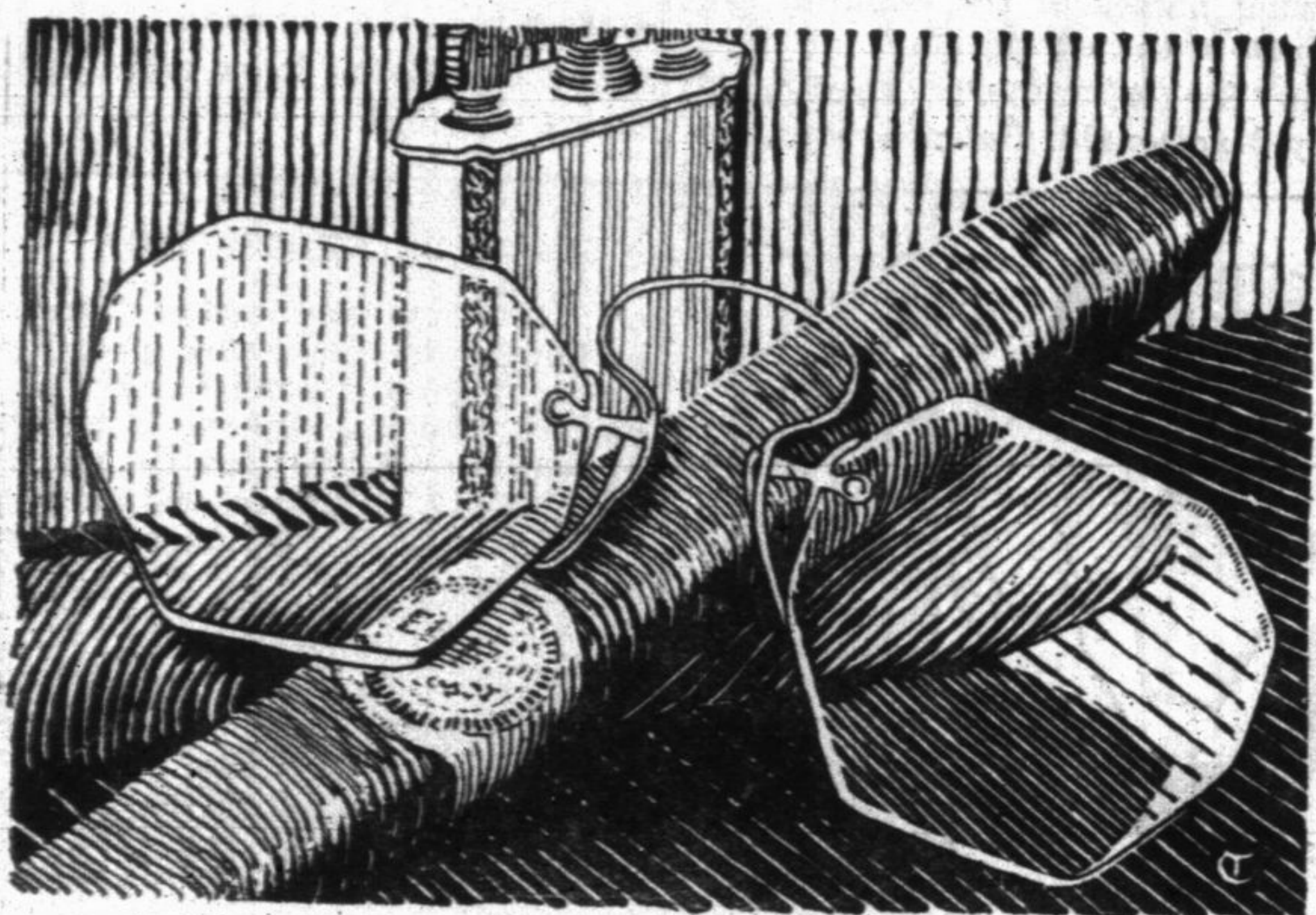

Libertyville Expects Industrial Expansion

A marked growth in the industrial activities of Libertyville is imminent, according to O. A. Newsom, chairman of the industrial committee of the Libertyville chamber of commerce, who is working on seeking factory locations.

One light industry with which the committee has been negotiating for the past two months plans the erection of a building in Libertyville and the factory will employ 250 men at the start. A building fund of \$150,000 has been raised for the construction work and this sum is available as soon as the deal is closed. This money is to be secured by bonds which will be retired over a period of two years.

Two prospective sites have been selected and have been submitted to the heads of the concern. It is expected that a favorable decision will be reached in the near future.

An option has been taken on a piece of property for another light industry which will employ from 50 to 75 skilled male laborers. Blue prints for a building 60x200 feet have been drawn and are now under consideration by the company.

Asst. Secretary of Navy Inspects Naval Station

Assistant Secretary of the Navy, Ernest Lee Jahncke, accompanied by his daughter, Miss Adelle Jahncke; his aids, Lieutenant-Commander R. O. Davis, U. S. Navy, and Lieutenant William G. Tomlinson, U. S. Navy; Frank Kent, of the Baltimore Sun; and Meigs Frost, of the New Orleans Times-Picayune, arrived at Sky Harbor last Wednesday in a Ford tri-motored plane from Moline, Illinois, enroute from the Pacific Coast to Washington, D. C.

Assistant Secretary Jahncke was met at Sky Harbor and escorted to the Great Lakes Naval Training Station by Lieutenant Francis H. Gilmer, U. S. Navy, personal aid to Rear Admiral Walter S. Crosley, U. S. Navy. Upon his arrival at Great Lakes the prescribed naval honors were rendered him.

Assistant Secretary Jahncke and his party were the guests at luncheon of Rear Admiral and Mrs. Crosley at the Commandant's House. The other guests were: Captain and Mrs. David Worth Bagley, Captain and Mrs. Charles P. Kindleberger, and Lieutenant Francis H. Gilmer.

After luncheon Assistant Secretary Jahncke reviewed the Training Station regiment, congratulated the graduating company, and shook hands with Jack T. McDonald, apprentice seaman, U. S. Navy, the honor recruit.

He then made a brief inspection of the training station, and proceeded by motor to Sky Harbor, taking his departure from that place in his plane for Dayton, Ohio, where he planned to spend the night, arriving in Washington the following day.
