North Shore Communities May See Giant Zeppelin

Highland Park, Lake Forest and other North Shore communities will be given an opportunity to see the giant Graf Zeppelin while the great aircraft is on the last leg of its around the world trip a month hence.

The Zeppelin will pass over these towns on its way from Chicago to Milwaukee.

Dr. Eckener, who has friends in Milwaukee of many years standing, is determined to visit that city on the flight and he has assured officials of that city that Milwaukee is on the itinerary of the world flight, which was started last week.

As the route of the great silver ship after reaching the Pacific coast is from Los Angeles to St. Louis and then to Chicago and on to Milwaukee, North Shore towns will be on the proposed route of flight of the Zeppelin.

The Zeppelin will be commanded by the same crew and the same passengers that took part in the round the world tour.

No definite date as to the arrival of the ship on its return trip to the United States in the world tour has been set but indications are that the Zeppelin will arrive here within a month's time.
