Chicago Motor Club Establishes Branch Offices Through City

With a view to close co-operation with the various communities in securing better traffic conditions, the Chicago Motor club is establishing thirty district branch offices in business districts throughout Cook county.

The district managers according to Charles M. Hayes, president of the club, will take an active interest in such subjects as street paving, street lighting, traffic control, parking regulations, traffic signs and other matters in their territory which are of vital interest to car-owners.

The offices will also offer detailed touring information concerning the region within a radius of 500 miles from Chicago. The personnel will be in a position at all times to route tourists over the best roads in that territory, and to supply up-to-the-minute information on detours, hotel and camping facilities, fishing and hunting, and other phases of traveling and vacationing via motor.

Mr. Hayes pointed out that the large number of branches is without precedent, no motor club ever having established such a large number of them in a territory the size of Cook county.

The club formerly maintained four branches in the county. Those offices co-operated with the residents in securing better motoring conditions, and set an enviable record of achievement, but after a careful survey the officials of the club decided that a branch should be founded in the center of every business district. With the materialization of such a plan, the possibilities for public service would be multiplied many times. The survey revealed thirty-one separate centers of population; the thirty-first center, i. e., the loop, is served by the main headquarters of the club at 66 East South Water street.

Largest Check Is Sent League by Rockefeller

The biggest check ever received by the League of Nations, either from a state member or any other source, was one from \$500,000 which arrived through the mails from New York.

The check, unexpected and unsolicited, was sent by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., as an advance on the \$2,000,000 contribution made by the Rockefellers towards the erection of the League's Library.

The remaining million and a half dollars will be available at any time the League calls for it in the meantime the unexpected part of the half million already received will draw interest for the League's library building fund.

Besides the gift of the Library the Rockefeller Foundation has contributed several hundred thousand dollars for the advancement of the League's health work and private organizations, largely financed by the Rockefeller millions have contributed generously to various social and economic activities of the League.
