the amount of water filtered so as to keep step with the amount pumped into the mains. This can not always be done, however, as sudden demands on the plant may exceed the normal output of the filters. In such cases, the temporary heavy demands will be cared for by drawing on the storage in the basin.

### Under Eight Contracts

The work of constructing the waterworks improvements is being done by contract, under the supervision of the designing engineers. For this purpose the project was divided into eight divisions, and contracts were awarded for each of these. The largest contract, involving over forty per cent of the total, is for division A, which includes all the structural work of the new plant. This contract was awarded to the Priester Construction company, of Davenport, Iowa. The filtered water basin, above described, is a part of their contract. They are represented in Highland Park by William Covemaker, as superintendent, assisted by R. T. Minney and L. W. Pannell.
