**INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING MAGIC
CIRCLE:** Cut out circle, lay on sheet of
plain paper with carbon paper between,
fasten to table with pin through center
spot. Mark short perpendicular line on
plain paper close to bottom edge of circle
as starting point. Turn circle around until
No. 1 is at starting point, then trace over
line marked No. 1 inside the circle. Turn
circle around to No. 2 at starting point
line line No. 2 inside circle and so on.

Freeport to Observe Lincoln and Douglas Debate Anniversary

A great era in American history,
the tense period just preceding the
civil war, will be colorfully recalled
at Freeport, August 27, when a new
statue of Abraham Lincoln will take
its place among the hundreds of like
memorials of the emancipator. It
will be the first statue to represent
Lincoln as the debater and will like-
wise be the first statue unveiled at
any of the seven places where Lin-
coln and Douglas met in joint debate
and made Illinois the battle ground
of the nation on the slavery issue.

In observance of the seventy-first
anniversary of the famous Lincoln-
Douglas debate in Freeport, August
27, 1858, a statue of Abraham Lin-
coln, the debater, will be unveiled at
Taylor Park, Freeport, August 27
this year, with notable ceremonies.
It is the work of Leonard Crunelle,
noted Chicago sculptor of the Taft
studios and is presented to the city
of Freeport by Hon. W. T. Rawleigh,
a prominent manufacturer and pub-
lic spirited citizen. It is a beautiful
statue of heroic size and represents
Lincoln in the full vigor of his man-
hood, keen and alert, before the cares
and responsibilities of the presidency
had saddened and sobered his coun-
tenance and spirit.

The chief oration of the day will
be given by United States Senator
George W. Norris, Nebraska. Other
speakers at the unveiling will be Le-
onard Crunelle, sculptor; W. T. Raw-
leigh, donor of the statue; John Wes-
ley Hill, Chancellor of the Lincoln
Memorial university; J. John A.
Swanson, state's attorney, Cook
county, Chicago and Dr. H. J. Burg-
stahler, president of Cornell college,
Mt. Vernon, Iowa.

Maj. Henry C. Hill Succeeds Green as Warden at Joliet

Maj. Henry C. Hill, Galesburg, has
been appointed warden of the state
penitentiaries at Joliet and State-
ville it was announced at Governor
Emmerson's office last week. He suc-
ceeds Elmer J. Green, Waukegan, who
resigned on the Saturday preceding.
Major Hill, who is 52 years old, is
a Spanish-American War veteran. In
1899 he entered the postal service at
Galesburg and in 1903 he was ap-
pointed a postoffice inspector. He
served from 1906 to 1909 as city
inspector in New York and resigned
in 1909 to take over special work in
Austria and Germany. For the New
York Credit Men's association.

In 1910 he became associated sales-
manager for the Thomas B. Jeffrey
company of Kenosha, Wis., and in
1914 on the outbreak of the World
War, was sent to England and France
in the interest of his company. In
1915 he took the European agency
for several motor truck companies
and in this capacity sold to French,
English, Belgian and Serbian gov-
ernments.

In 1915 upon the return to this
country, he engaged in business in
Galesburg. During the war he was
active in Red Cross work, Liberty
Loan drives and served as chief of
the American Protective league in
his county.
