### CULINARY HINTS

In making a Peach Souffle Pie Select firm ripe peaches and chill in ice box before peeling. When fresh peaches are out of season the canned ones may be used, draining them well and using only 1/4 cup of sugar.

#### Peach Souffle Pie

- 2 cups fresh peaches
- 4 egg whites
- 1/2 cup sugar
- Few grains salt
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract

Beat egg whites very stiff, add sugar a little at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in peaches cut in small pieces and the almond.

Place in a baked pie shell and bake at 300 until firm and a pointed knife comes out clean when cut down into the filling. This will require about 35 to 40 minutes.

Serve with whipped cream or with a soft custard, if preferred. To 1/2 pint of cream whipped, add 1/2 cup sugar and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla.
