larly true in the case of the Ravinia school, through all the stages of its development and of the Allendale farm at Lake Villa, of which he might well be considered the patron saint. Indeed Allendale is largely a monument to his genius.

Mr. Buck was universally beloved in Ravinia. Less than forty families there when he came, he interpreted to those who followed him the real spirit of Ravinia taught them to appreciate and preserve its natural beauty. His idea of neighborliness was one of the many beautiful traits of character which endeared him to his friends. He was ever ready with his pencil to make the needed sketch—to show a way out of a difficulty—to transform an ugly house into a thing of beauty—to lay out a garden or plan a park. His brush was a wand with which he worked magic.

Artist of Note

He was well known as a water color artist of note. Many of his beautiful pictures have been exhibited from time to time at the Art Institute and elsewhere—pictures of rare quality which reveal his genius.

Mr. Buck was a leader and moving spirit of the Saturday Afternoon Sketch group and was an inspiration to all who knew him. A man of fine principles and high ideals he has left an indelible stamp of his unique personality upon this community.

His widow, Mrs. Letty Buck, his daughter, Virginia, and his sister. Miss Mina Buck of Evanston, survive. Services were held Sunday afternoon, August 18, at 27 North Sheridan road, and cremation followed at Graceland cemetery.
