



Aged Wauconda Woman Killed in Auto Crash

Miss Mary Hall, 78 years old, of Route 1 near Wauconda, was killed instantly Friday night and Roy Blue, a relative who makes his home with her was seriously injured when the car in which they were riding plunged into a ditch as they were traveling down hill at a fast rate of speed.

Mrs. Blue, who was also in the car, was slightly injured.

The three were riding down a little used side road about two and one-half miles west of Lake Zurich, somewhat north of Barrington, when Blue, who was driving, lost control of the car as they were going down hill. The car plunged into a ditch and when a farmer living near by reached the scene of the accident, Miss Hall was dead and Blue was unconscious.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF TAXES FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, FOR THE YEAR 1929: BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: That the Annual Appropriation bill making appropriations for corporate purposes for the City of Highland Park for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 1929, and ending April 30, 1930, was filed the 24th day of June, 1929, duly passed July 1st, 1929, and approved July 2, 1929, and thereafter published as provided by law, which said ordinance by reference is hereby made a part hereof.

SECTION 2: That the sum of Two Hundred Seventy-one Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$271,275.00) having been heretofore legally appropriated for corporate purposes to be collected from the taxes to be levied for said fiscal year beginning May 1st, 1929, and ending April 30th, 1930, be and the same is hereby levied upon all property subject to taxation within the City of Highland Park, as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County Purposes for the said current year.

That the purposes for which said amount of Two Hundred Seventy-one Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$271,275.00) heretofore appropriated and hereby levied respectively are as follows, to-wit:
