Mr. Peters presided at dinner and the meeting at the Onwentsia club where 80 sat down to a bountiful feast. By way of introducing the subject Mr. Peters stated that those engaged in golf matters are in it for the love of it and introduced Mr. W. A. Alexander, the veteran golfer of the mid-west, who spoke in a most interesting way of the early golf history of the United States and how he had played golf on a sheep pasture within a stone's throw of where he now stood.

Mr. Alexander built several golf courses in 1894 and 1895 and impressed his listeners with the necessity of properly built courses to make real golfers, and dwelt somewhat on the subject of the importance of grasses especially on the putting greens which should be of great value to the profession generally as Mr. Alexander's opinion is the result of long and valuable experience. The speaker in no small terms gave the late Dr. Piper great credit for the work he has done for golf throughout our country, also Mr. Peters and Mr. Lasker for the work they have done and are doing.

Appreciate Lasker Aid

It was Mr. Lasker's generous grant of ground for the experimental station that made it possible and Mr. Lasker is not only a golf enthusiast but a genuine sportsman who spares no expense to further the game of golf.
