

Moody Institute Bible School Open Evenings After September 10th

The fall term of the evening school of the Moody Bible Institute will open Tuesday, September 10. This department of the institute's teeming life is experiencing constant and steady growth, for a number of years the enrollment having increased with each year.

Library Exhibits Beautiful Sampler

A sampler of unique and beautiful workmanship is now on exhibit at the Public Library. It was made by a Highland Park woman who realizes perhaps more than any other individual in the city, the great effort necessary to produce a perfect sampler.

The samplers of our grandmothers have long been choice mementoes of their childhood. They carry a personal touch of their early years but few have but a vague realization of the painstaking care required to produce a sampler which is perfect in design and layout. Many stitches are taken out and replaced and each three counted over and over to bring each word into its proper location.

The motto found on this sampler now on display is a product of the age before the invention of printing and carries a message of great significance to-day.

It is entitled:

A Tribute to Books
