has been Chief Tiffany's co-operation with the state's attorney's office that in all trials of his cases in circuit court, verdicts of guilty have been secured. In the same period the police court fines turned into the Lake Forest city treasury totalled \$16,114. Tiffany is known as a courageous police officer and has pledged himself to enforce the law without fear or favor.

Tiffany's well known willingness to co-operate with law enforcing bodies and his excellent record in office indicate that his nomination and election as sheriff would place a capable and efficient officer in that office, his friends believe, and they are confident that in such event the sheriff's office would be conducted in a manner wholly satisfactory.

Tiffany is the first candidate for sheriff from this section of the county in many years, and there is every prospect that he will receive widespread support.

While no other formal announce-

ments have been made, it is reported by Waukegan papers that unofficially Deputy Sheriff H. A. Doolittle, father of the present sheriff; Detective Sergeant Bart Tyrrell of the Waukegan police department; Edwin Ahlstrom and Supervisor E. A. Brown of Round Lake have been mentioned from time to time as possible candidates for sheriff.
