The Deerfield telephone exchange will have a new manager after September 15. Mrs. Frances Flood Garrity is being transferred by her own request to the Northbrook office, where she will occupy a new apartment and have less arduous duties.

The history of Deerfield says: "In 1914 Mrs. Frances Garrity took charge of the exchange, and when one board was all that was necessary for the needs of the village, with one operator, a service second to no other was maintained. So faithful was she in the discharge of her duties, and so remarkable was her memory of calls made, that if an attempt had been made by a subscriber to get a desired party and was unsuccessful because of the absence of the one called, that when the latter indicated her return home by telephoning someone, Mrs. Garrity would say, "Mrs. \_\_\_\_\_ has been trying to get you," and thus complete the call hours afterward."

Many instances could be cited of her quick intelligence and keen sympathy in times of disasters and accidents, when help was needed, in securing aid of various kinds. No eight-hour day has been observed by Mrs. Garrity. Her duties frequently kept her without sleep for the hours necessary for health.

The Deerfield exchange now has four switchboards. A supervisor, a chief operator, and a crew of efficient operators is expected to be brought from Highland Park for the service of over six hundred subscribers.
