Jack's client, it seems, had the happy thought of selling the rails on the defunct railway and a price of \$10,000 was accepted by him. Before many rails were ripped up the deal was called to an abrupt halt by stockholders.

About that time the locomotive, affectionately known as "Old Maude," was sold. When it came time to make delivery it was discovered that the torn out rails made this little thing impossible so "Old Maude," the attorney declared, is rusting herself to an early grave.

As junk, Jack says, the locomotive represents real money. The road is to be sold in the fall and the property liquidated.
