**Thrift Education in
Local Schools Resumed**

Tuesday was bank day in a number of suburban schools. This means that school children of Evanston, Oak Park, Forest Park, Maywood, Des Plaines, Park Ridge, Lake Forest, Highland Park, Glen Ellyn, Hammond and other towns in the Chicago territory have resumed their regular weekly deposits in the school savings bank.

It is all a part of thrift education, the newest thing in the curriculum, this regular banking by school children encouraged by the boards of education and carried on under auspices of local banks. Any school child may take part, from the tiniest tot in kindergarten to the most sedate senior in high school. And anything goes from a penny up.

The idea of Thrift education is to help the child form habits of saving. The systematic setting aside of even so small a sum as a dime or a nickel has a way of making the child understand the value of money and of many other things, such as clothes, school books, even of the value of time. So the educators have discovered and the school banking classes now have the full endorsement of the National Education association, the Parent-Teacher's association and the American Bankers association.
