

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the Levy of Taxes for the Highland Park East Park District for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1929, to May 31, 1930.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, County of Lake and State of Illinois:

SECTION 1. That whereas the annual appropriation ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Making Appropriations for Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1929, to May 31, 1930," was duly passed on the 4th day of June, A. D. 1929, and approved on the 4th day of June, A. D. 1929, and thereafter on the 13th day of June, A. D. 1929, was duly published as provided by law, which ordinance by reference is hereby made a part hereof; Now, Therefore,

SECTION 2. The sum of Seventy-three

Thousand One Hundred and Five (\$73,105.00) Dollars having been heretofore legally appropriated for corporate purposes to be collected from taxes levied for said fiscal year beginning June 1, 1929, and ending May 31, 1930, the said sum be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to taxation within the Highland Park East Park District as the same is assessed and equalized for state and county purposes for said current year.

SECTION 3. That the purposes for which said amount of Seventy-three Thousand One Hundred and Five (\$73,105.00) Dollars was heretofore appropriated and is hereby levied, respectively, are as follows, to-wit:
