### Going to College

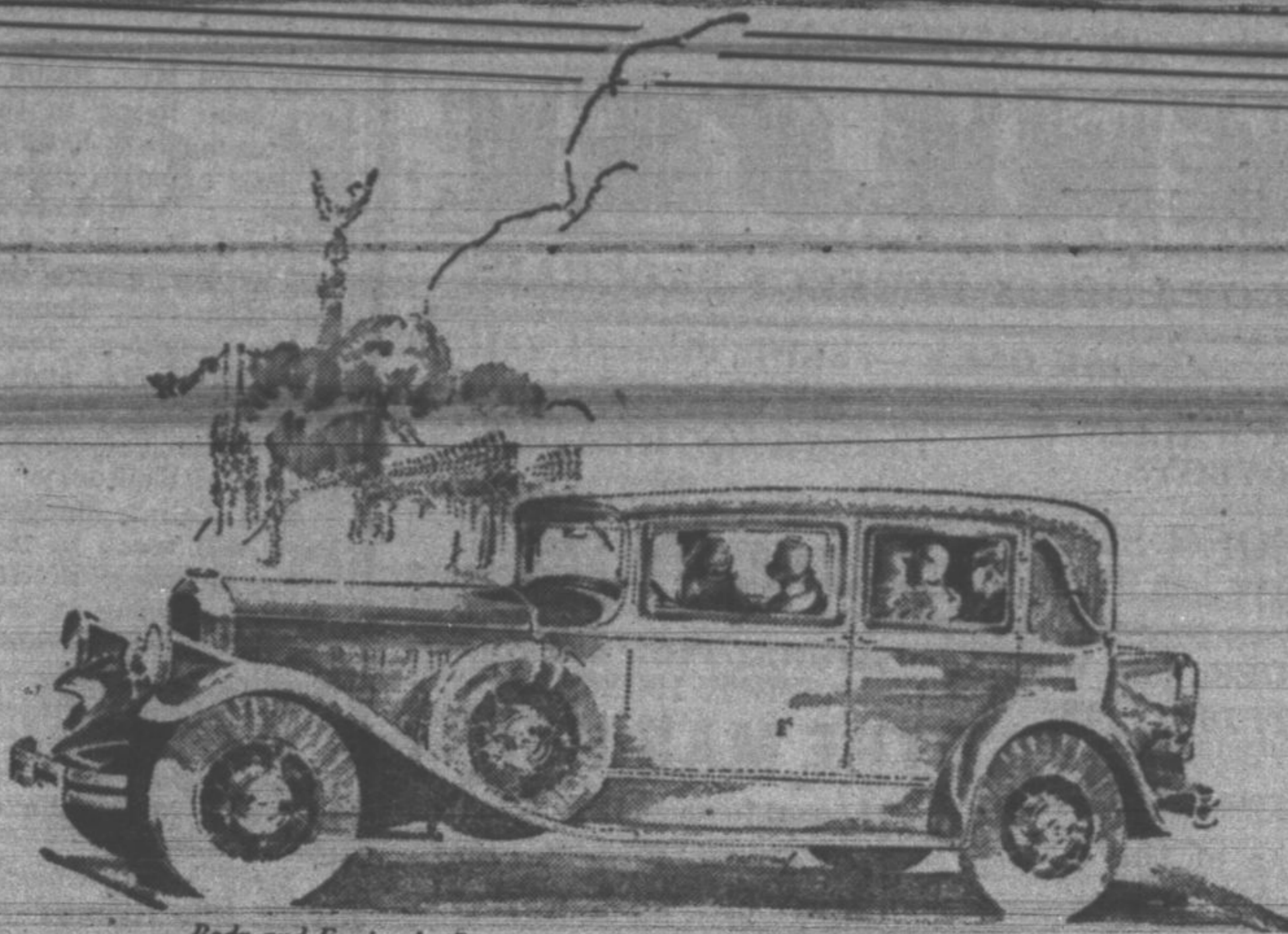
