lead to the second floor which has three rooms, one of which will serve as a balcony when the auditorium is added. The other rooms will serve as a music room and library or group room.

The north wing has four class rooms each of which is provided with a work room with hot and cold running water, gas plate, work bench and cupboard space. Three of the rooms have large stone fireplaces which add much to their beauty as well as the comfort. Each room has ample cupboard space with individual compartments for each child; separate cloak rooms and teachers closets.

The wood work throughout is stained a grey-green and the furniture is finished to match. The walls are ivory colored rough finished plaster. Everything has been done to combine beauty with utility, and the result is a beautiful modern school of which the community may well be proud. The following is a list of contractors:

Combine Grades

At present the third and fourth grades of twenty-two pupils are combined under the charge of Miss Dorthea Marxsen who is also the head or principal of the school. Miss Esther Christie has charge of the first and second grades with an enrollment of about twenty-three pupils and Miss Elizabeth Wheeler has ten kindergarten pupils. It is hoped that some of the children now attend-

ing the crowded Ravinia kindergarten may be transferred to the Braeside school.

Enrollment

Ravinia school has an enrollment this year of 333, five more than last September. This is an increase of sixty children counting those who are now in Braeside.

Lincoln school has an enrollment of 344 an increase of nineteen over last year. West Ridge school has about the same number as last year, thirty-two pupils.
