a connected system of water mains in South Green Bay road, etc., under warrant No. 281 and the construction of a system of sanitary sewers in South Green Bay road, etc., under warrant No. 282, were accepted and that the corporation counsel was instructed to present said petitions to the county court for approval.

George L. Vetter was appointed the officer to spread the assessment providing for the construction of a concrete outlet drain pipe extension in Clavey road, Highland Park special assessment No. 343.

Protest Received

A protest was presented to the council by approximately twenty-five property owners and residents living in the vicinity of the Highland Park Gardens subdivision against the city constructing an incinerator plant on their property in Mooney's Commercial subdivision.

Approval and acceptance of a plat, entitled "Westview," was voted.

Mayor Lewis appointed B. C. Howes a member of the library board for a period of three years beginning July 1, 1929 to succeed Mr. Russell Mott, and the appointment was confirmed.

The motion prevailed.

The Rayfield Manufacturing Co. was awarded the contract for the installation of an oil burner in the new city hall building in accordance with

their bid submitted to the council on June 24th, 1929.

The bond of Don McNeil covering his contract for sidewalks on Walker avenue and on South Sheridan road was approved, and also those of J. Bernard Mullen and the Hart-Pederson Glass Co., in connection with the city hall building.

fees \$3,845.77; salaries \$10,721.31; and miscellaneous claims \$1,964.56.

The appropriation outlined by the finance committee under Chairman Arthur Vercoe, of Highland Park, a year ago had provided for \$525,300 for county operation. In all \$558,031.77 was needed or \$26,239.41 more than provided through the budget.

The appropriation has been chipped as short as possible for the past five years by the finance committee in hopes that the county could recover from the debt it staggers under. The receipts from taxes have been inadequate for several years due largely, according to Supervisor William J. Obee, of Highland Park, to the fact that the county is blessed with entertaining a large part of Chicago's population without receiving any revenue from it.

Higher for 1930

The appropriation, Vercoe stated, will run a little higher for the coming year. He stated that no definite amount could be given as yet as the committee has not met.
