Miss Catherine Geary and Miss Helen Leuer left on Sunday for Webster college where Miss Geary will enter her junior year.

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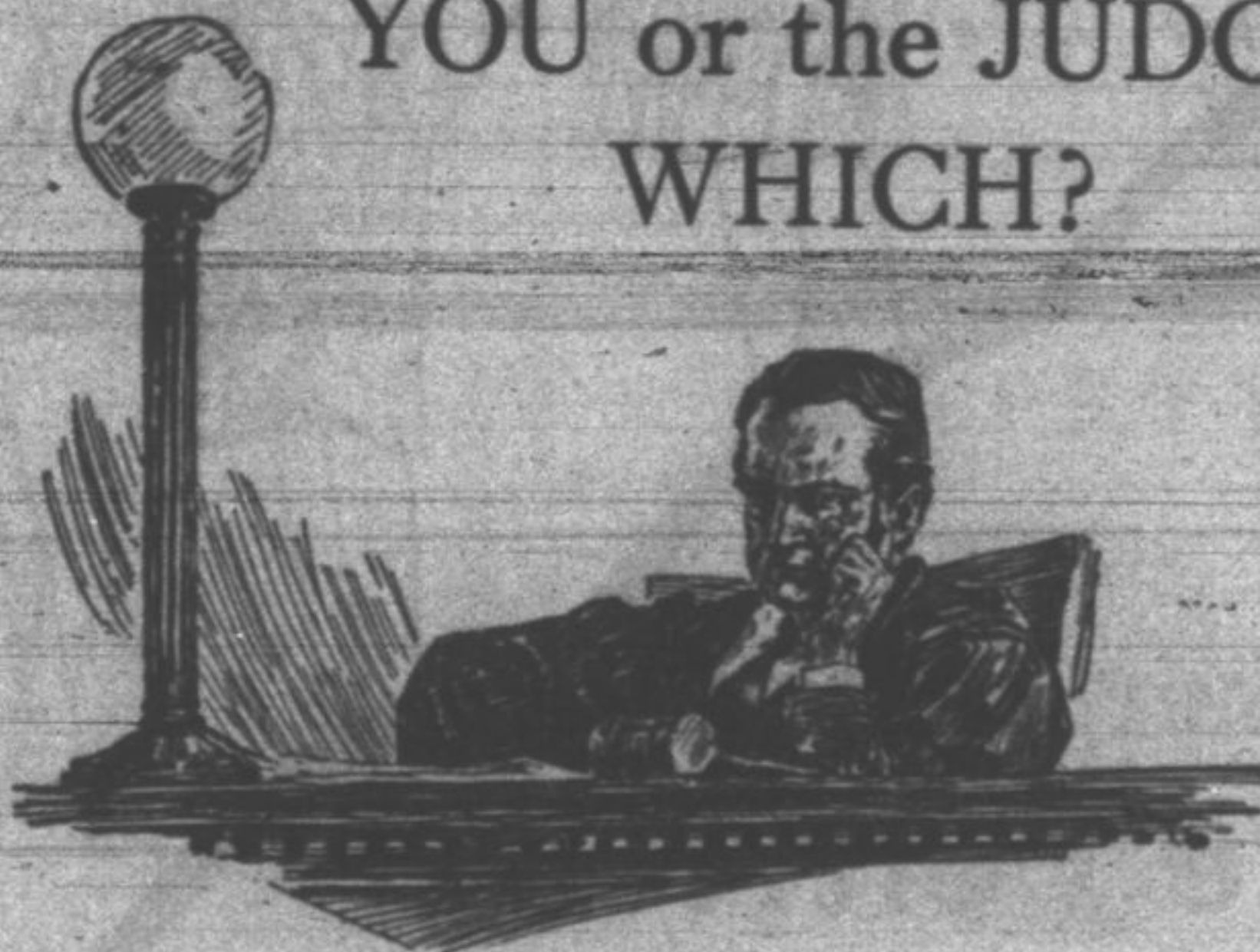
