### Invite Scouts

Last week notice was published that scouts were invited to the Illinois-Kansas game at Urbana. Now invitation is also extended by the University of Chicago and Northwestern to scouts of Illinois to their opening games on October 5th at 1:30 p. m. University of Chicago plays Beloit and Lake Forest at Stagg Field. Northwestern plays Butler and Cornell college at Dyche Stadium.

Take your chance scouts and get your scoutmaster to take you to the games. All scouts must be accompanied by adult leadership and should wear the scout uniform and bring their registration card. This invitation is extended to all registered scout leaders as well, including committeemen and scoutmasters.

### Courts of Honor

There will be no Boards of Review or Courts of Honor for the month of September. Community Wide Courts of Honor will be held in October in each of the towns in the area. All applications for merit badges and badges of rank which reach the council headquarters on or before the last day of this month will be awarded in the October court. All camp awards such as satisfactory camper, honor camper, Makajawan M. etc. will be awarded also in these courts.

### Scouts As Ushers

### Scout Camporee Fall Feature

"A Scout Camporee in each of the 12 towns of the North Shore Area council will feature the fall scouting program," announces Myron C. Ry-

bolt, scout executive. A camporee is an outdoor camp exhibit and demonstration put on by the scouts to give the towns' people a better conception of all phases of camp life as promoted by the scout movement. The camporee will include various spectacular contests such as camp pitching, string burning, wood chopping and fire by friction; it will include demonstrations of camp cooking, camp cooking, camp fires, nature study, camp handicraft, and pioneering. There will also be special exhibition stunts of scoutcrafts.

These camporees will be staged from 3:30 to 6:30 in the afternoons of these dates in October and November. October 11, Glenview and Deerfield; October 12, Wilmette and Libertyville at Half Day; October 18, Glencoe and Lake Forest; October 19, Highland Park and Kenilworth; October 26, Mundelein and Diamond Lake at Diamond Lake; November 1, Lake Forest at Everett, Mundelein and Diamond Lake at Mundelein; November 2, Libertyville, Northbrook.

### Announces Weekly Service
