Superintendent Supervisors How Funds May Be Used

Completion of the highway system, s worked out several years ago by the road and bridge committee and R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways, will break up the congestion through county towns Lobdell advised the county board of supervisors yesterday while explaining the methods open for the financing of the program.

Building of the road connecting with the Millburn route at Grand avenue through Druce Lake, Gages Corners, Mundelein, Diamond Lake, Half Day and down to the Cook county line, will bear a large portion of the traffic that has knotted up Libertyville streets over the weekend, he pointed out. In addition the construction of the cut-off from Half Day northwest near Diamond Lake and on toward Volo and into the Fox Lake and Lake Geneva district, will also attract many motorists, he declared.

In Fourth Stage

The program, which has now reached the fourth stage, has witnessed the construction of nearly all the main arteries connecting villages with each other and providing an outlet through the county for through traffic.

In all about 50 miles of pavement will be needed and the anticipated expenditure will run close to \$2,000,000. The money will come from the \$500,of \$110,000 to \$120,000 from the gasoline tax.

Lobdell advised the board that the alternative was to spend the money as received and complete the program in ten to twelve years or to present a bond issue and complete the construction in three to four years and discharge the bonds with the money as it came into the county possession.

Widening was not discussed at the conference: In the past Lobdell has taken the position that the primary and secondary road system should be treated with first and widening then considered. State aid along this line is not unlikely as Cook county and Wisconsin motorists travel the roads in large numbers.
