## Begin Work Soon on Citizens State Bank

The following article appeared in Chicago Sunday Tribune:

Work will start as soon as bids have been received and contracts awarded on the new Citizens State bank of Deerfield. Its backers hope to have the building completed by the first of November. The building designed by Solon L. Reilly of Glencoe and Chicago will face west on Waukegan road near its intersection with Deerfield road. It will have an Indiana limestone front.

The bank was chartered July 15 by the Illinois banking department with paid in capital, surplus and reserve of \$62,500. John L. Walker president of the Citizens State bank of Glencoe, and of the Fort Dearborn Insurance company of Chicago is the president. E. K. Butler II, an official of the Glencoe bank is vice president.
