MAKING PROGRESS ON WEST HIGHWAY

To Extend from McCormick Boulevard North Along Shore; Present Status

Progress is being made on plans, now two years old, for a superhigh-way paralleling the tracks on the west side of the Northwestern rail-road from Evanston north. Its purpose is to relieve congestion on the narrow and tortuous Sheridan road.

The western route is used by many motorists even in its present condition especially on the eastern boulevard are held to a snail's pace. However, there is a need for much widening and paving before Railroad avenue, as it is most generally known, is able to serve any volume of high speed traffic.

Evanston to Pave Street

When Railroad avenue is completed it will receive the bulk of its north-bound traffic from the northern end of McCormick road, although it will also connect with Asbury street and Ridge avenue. At the northern end of Railroad avenue, the cars will flow into Sheridan road, Green Bay road, and route 22 in Glencoe, Highland Park and Highwood.

Evanston has passed an ordinance ordering the paving of Railroad avenue from McCormick road to the southern limits of Wilmette to a width of 51 feet. At present, this stretch is passable, but the rough brick-surface makes speed dangerous.

Wilmette has laid 52 feet of concrete from Evanston to Elmwood avenue. Just north of Elmwood, there is a house on a triangular lot that is in the right of way. This situation is expected to be adjusted this winter so that construction progress can continue in the early spring.

Jog Around Obstruction
In using Railroad avenue under its
present conditions, cars jog around
this triangle on a small concrete surfaced detour that consists of going
west on Elmwood avenue to Fifteenth
street and north on Fifteenth to Rail-

road avenue again.

The village of Kenilworth has had difficulties in trying to open up its right of way. However, most of the required property has been dedicated by owners, leaving only a small portion to be obtained by condemnation proceedings. It is expected that the suburb will be able to start paving at the beginning of next year's construction season.

Glencoe is considering six different plans for its share of the Railroad avenue project. One calls for the depression of the boulevard with cross streets on bridges. The Cook county bond issue program calls for the widening of Green Bay road to 40 feet from Dundee road to the Lake county line. Highland Park is widening Green Bay road from the Cook county line north to the northern limits of the village.
