

**Bright Colors Boost
Sales in School Cafe;
Decorations Helpful**

Bright colors have been proven efficient salesmen in the restaurant of the Smedley high school, Chester, Pa., according to Woman's Home Companion. **Recommend Signals
at Death Crossing**

Recommendation that the Soo line install suitable warning signal devices at the crossing of Ivanhoe road over that railroad a short distance south of the Belvidere road crossing was made by the coroner's jury, following an inquest into death of Edward L. Parker, prominently known farmer of near Grayslake.

The jury held, however, that in its opinion the death of Parker was due to an unavoidable accident. The inquest was held last week.

Parker was killed when his automobile was struck by train No. 14, a limited train between Minneapolis and Chicago due at this crossing at 7:42 o'clock. The automobile was demolished and the driver was instantly killed. The impact also resulted in damage to one of the cylinders on the locomotive and the train was delayed for nearly an hour.
