**Waukegan Man Dies**  
Last Week Aged 93;  
Lived Long in County

Michael Studer, an aged and prominent resident of Lake county passed away at the home of his daughter, Miss Emma E. Studer of 17 North St. James street last week after an extended period of illness due to his advanced age. He was 93 years of age.

The deceased was born in Fairville, N. Y., and came to Lake county in the early sixties locating on a farm near Gurnee. Although he resided on the farm for the greater part of his life he also followed the vocation of a contractor and builder and many of the buildings now standing in Warren township are the product of his hands.

In 1912 he moved to Grayslake where he resided for three years before coming to Waukegan to make his home with his daughter, 14 years ago.

His wife passed away in 1903, Grover Studer of Grayslake and Leroy Studer of Gurnee survive him.

Funeral services were held Saturday.

Public Notice is hereby given that the County Court of Lake County, Illinois, has rendered judgment for a special assessment upon property benefited by the following improvement: The construction of a connected system of sanitary sewers with necessary manholes and septic tank in Ridge Road, Ridgley Road, Old Briar Road, Balsam Road, Poplar Road, Blossom Court and other streets in the City of Highland Park; Lake County, Illinois, and the creation of a sewer district therein, as will more fully appear from the certified copy of the judgment on file in my office. That the warrant for collection of such assessment is in the hands of the undersigned.
