Glencoe Man, Caught in Trap Door, Dies

Victor L. Peruse, age 75, member of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and who up to a few months ago was employed as flagman at a Hubbard Woods crossing of the Chicago & North Western railroad, was found dead last week in his home, 531 Monroe street, Glencoe, where he lived alone.

A floor door leading to the basement presumably fell on him as he was either ascending or descending the steps. The door apparently struck him on the back of the neck, possibly rendering him unconscious and catching his head in such a way as to strangle him.

His lifeless body was discovered by a mail carrier, Walter Menue, when he called to deliver mail. Menue notified the police.

A coroner's jury returned a verdict of accidental death.
