Dragged for Many Feet Indications are that the youth fell from the seat of the machine into the path of the cutter bar and was drawn into the reaper before he could save himself. With the blade of the reel pressing down on the throat the body was dragged for more than 75 feet by the frightened horses.

The body of the victim was removed to the farm home, where an inquest was held by Dr. J. L. Taylor, county coroner, in the evening. The body was then taken to an undertaking establishment at Desplaines.
