### TWO MURDER CASES BEFORE GRAND JURY

North Chicago and Highland Park Men Defendants; Score of Other Cases

Among the most important cases which will be heard are those concerning two alleged slayers, Albert Mihan of North Chicago and George Sullivan of Highland Park, North Chicago Killing

Mihan on April 22 shot and killed Arthur Jadrich, 22, of 266 Twentysecond street, North Chicago, during a drinking bout at the killer's home, 2138 Grove street. Mrs. Mihan later related the cause of the shootingan alleged attempt made by Jadrich to attack her as she sought rest on a davenport in her home.

The North Chicago police took Mihan into custody shortly after the shooting and later turned him over to the office of the sheriff. The wife who was an eye witness to the killing, will be the star witness for the state when her husband's case is brought up.

Held in Landlady's Death George Sullivan of Highland Park. is being held in connection with the murder of Mrs. George McGraw of 144 North First street, Highland Park where he was a roomer. He is charged with having killed the 45 year old woman with a hammer and an ice pick when he became jealous over attentions which were being paid the woman by two other rdomers G. M. Jones and John Mahoney.

Sullivan still denies his guilt.

#### Think Gas Tax May Bring \$30,000,000 Annually in State

Forecasters are hurriedly revising earlier estimates of the total amount of revenue to be derived by the state from the new 3-cent gasoline tax law during the first month it has been in effect, according to a report from Springfield.

With \$2,435,555.12 already collected and with reports from about 10 per cent of the dealers not received, the total for August is expected to approximate \$2,500,000.

\$30,000,000 A Year?

Based on these figures the gas tax revenue for the year should aggregate \$30,000,000, of which the state will receive \$20,000,000 and the counties the remainder.

The first month's collection under the new law is far and away in advance of any month's collection under the defunct 1927 2-cent law.

Taxes from motor vehicle registration to date for the year are \$16,653,-755 and indications are that by the end of the year they will reach the \$17,000,000 mark, which total is far in advance of any previous year.

Tax Law Under Fire The new tax now is under fire in Sangamon County Circuit Court and no matter what the lower courts' decision may be the matter will be taken before the state Supreme Court, probably at the December or February term.


