Defeating the Marlatt Brothers of Hawk Springs, Wyoming, in two hard baseball games at Waukegan the Stanzak Brothers of Waukegan became the holders of the brother team championship of the world.

Voters of Waukegan have approved the building of an eight-room addition to the North school and also the issuance of \$40,000 in bonds to finance the project.

Mrs. Annie Christine Rasmussen, wife of Sofus Rasmussen, veteran Waukegan shoe dealer and shoe repairman, died at her home, 724 Muirfield avenue, in that city, after a short illness.

Harry Torosian, administrator for the estate of Kolost Torosian, Waukegan, has filed suit in Circuit court for \$10,000 against Ralph Trepanier, also of Waukegan, whose motorcycle struck and killed Kolost Torosian Sept. 1 at South avenue and Genesee street.

Fire, believed to have been started by lightning, destroyed a large barn on the old Marsh homestead, now owned and farmed by Everett Marsh, and located on Milwaukee avenue, just south of Belvidere road.

Waukegan Has Bombing Last Week; Nobody Hurt

Under cover of the night, two men in a wine-colored sedan planted a black powder bomb on the porch of 136 Market street, the home of Harry Boyd, Negro political leader and soft drink vendor of Market street, late last week, blowing a hole in the floor of the porch, and shattering all of the windows on the south side of the

house. An unidentified man and woman were the only occupants of the house. They were unhurt.

The bombers were seen by George Jackson, 528 Market street, and John Taylor, 135 Market street, who were returning from town as the sedan speeded past them and pulled to a stop before Boyd's house. One of the two men within the car stepped to the sidewalk and ran lightly up the stairs, coming down in a moment.

The car then sped away north.

In ten minutes a terrific report, heard all over the city, set the porch aflame for a moment, and died down again, leaving its trace in a gaping hole in the wood.
