orators. Then senior partner, Silas Brand, died in 1912, but the business continued under the management of George Brand until 1922, when he retired after being in business continuously for 50 years. He was succeeded by his two sons, Leslie and Irving.

Twelve years ago he was stricken with blindness, and three years ago, last July 13, he became paralyzed. In spite of these afflictions his family and friends always found him cheerful and patient. It was a real pleasure to visit him.

Former Alderman

He had been active in the affairs of the city, having served several terms as alderman; also several terms as town collector and trustee of the church of his choice, namely the Bethany church. For 20 consecutive years he was Sunday school superintendent or teacher. For 10 years after his

blindness he continued to teach the Senior Bible class.

For 48 years Mr. Brand and his family lived in the residence on S. Second street which he built and occupied until he sold it to the Udell Printing company, about three years ago. Then he built a new home in Deerfield, adjacent to those of his sons, Irving and Leslie, and there he spent his last years.

On Dec. 26, 1928, he and Mrs. Brand celebrated their golden wedding anniversary, at which time they

received the warm congratulations of their host of friends in this section.

Funeral on Tuesday

The funeral service was held Tuesday afternoon, at 2 o'clock, at the family residence on Deerfield road, Deerfield. Rev. H. F. Siemsen, pastor of Bethany Evangelical church officiated, assisted by the presiding elder, A. J. Byas of Chicago. Interment was in the Northfield cemetery. The service was attended by a large number of old friends from Highland Park and Deerfield.
