sull were at home and also as to what time they would be at home and the time of their usual dinner hour. This, the police say may have been an attempt by the thieves to ascertain where the family would be at the dinner hour, or may have no connection whatever with the robbery, depending what is brought to light by further investigation.

According to the reports to the police the servants are all old employes of the family, and from present indications the robbery seems to have been wholly an outside job.

Some of the jewelry had been worn by Mrs. Insull Monday night at a theatre. According to Chief Edward Moroney, she did not miss the property until Wednesday morning.
