# Report of Lake Co. W.C.T.U. Convention; Interesting Program

The 34th annual convention of the Women's Christian Temperance union of Lake county at Waukegan, October 3 and 4, was an encouraging, inspiring event. The unions of all the towns in the county reported increased membership and reviewed interest in Prohibition. Waukegan enrolled 89 new members and now has membership of 500 members. The Baby union was organized this summer at Grays lake.

Four institutes were held in different towns of the county—bringing to the people the real facts about the economic and social benefits of Prohibition with contests for medals in public speaking to interest young people. The funds of the organization are used mainly for education through literature and speakers and relief work in county institutions.

The county superintendent is encouraging the teachers of the public schools in carrying on scientific temperance education, teaching this generation the bad effects of alcohol, the necessity for Prohibition, and the Patriotic duty of obeying the Constition and supporting the Government in proper law enforcement. The W. C. T. U. co-operates by giving prizes for best work of pupils.

The County Court probation officer told about the new court problems, the woman bootlegger, the children of bootleggers, their relation to teachers, public officers and the community.

The convention closed with stirring speach by the state president, Miss Helen Wood, telling of the work of combatting the fierce campaign in Illinois to nullify the 18th Amendment, commending the loyal stand of the last Legistature for the Constitution and the splendid example set by the Administration in Washington, and the authoritative aid to the National Prohibition cause by the President's active interest in law enforcement.
