

Niles Center Builds Four-Story Warehouse

Industrial development in Niles Center has been given new impetus with the start of construction work on a four-story warehouse on Cicero avenue, one block north of Oakton street, near the North Shore line and "L" right-of-way. The structure, which is to cost \$85,000, is being built by the Metropolitan District Realty Trust for the Scully Storage & Transfer company, now located in Winnetka. It is scheduled for completion early in 1930.

This is the first "skyscraper" for the new suburban community of Niles Center, which has experienced unusual development as a home community since the North Shore line and Rapid Transit lines extended their service there. The building will be a modern fireproof structure of concrete and steel, with the street elevation of stone.

Space for stores will be provided on the first floor of the structure, with the upper three floors especially designed for storage purposes. It designed by Stanton & Hodgdon, architects.

HIGH COURT RULES TAX MONEY STATE'S

Says Funds Collected from Gasoline Dealers Belongs to Commonwealth

The state supreme court ruled that the \$6,000,000 collected under the defunct 1927 state gas tax belongs to the state in a decision at Springfield a few days ago. The state tribunal's action today reversed a decision of the lower courts and held that the payments were voluntary and passed on to dealers.

The action of the high court in re-

versing the lower court is tantamount to declaring claims of companies in other suits along the same line and also involving taxes collected and paid into the state treasury, are without grounds.

The court's decision was written by the late Cyrus E. Dietz, who died of injuries sustained when he fell from a horse at Moline recently.

Payments Voluntary

The decision held that the tax payments by the companies were voluntary and that since the companies do not purpose returning the tax to the customers who paid it, they are not in equity entitled to relief.

"It does not appear," said the decision, "that the complaint here regarding the tax to be illegal or that

it questioned the validity of the act. Neither is it shown that the complaint objected to the operation of the act or to the payment of the tax thereby imposed. On the contrary, the bill avers that as soon as the act became effective the complaint applied for and took out a license thereunder, made all of the reports and payments under such license at the time the payment in question was made."
