Condell Hospital at Libertyville Faces Financial Difficulties

The financial plight of the Condell Memorial hospital came alarming last week when three local banks called their loans on the institution, aggregating \$10,000, says the Lake County Register, which continues:

The banks served notice on board of trustees last Friday they cannot renew their loans. G. Ray, president of the hospital board, has called a special meeting of the trustees for this week to discuss the matter.

Final notices are being prepared by Trustee Max Kohner which will be sent to all persons who have pledged their pledges. A survey of hospital records show that there remains \$12,329.81 in unpaid pledges which were subscribed three years ago during the hospital drive.

The majority of the pledges were to be paid in installments over three year period. The records show that in many cases persons signed pledges have never made payment. The pledges range in amount from \$5 to \$1500.

Just what action will be taken at the final notices asking payment has not been sent out is problematical at this time. One thing is certain according to the hospital board; funds must be raised in the next 30 days or Libertyville may be without a hospital.

Chinese Collections At Field Museum Best

An outstanding division of the department of anthropology at Field Museum of Natural History is that containing the vast Chinese collections, ranking among the best in the world. The material displayed consists in the main of the results of two expeditions, the Blackstone Expedition, and the Marshall Field Jr. Expedition, which were both led by Dr. Berthold Laufer, the museum's curator of anthropology. Both the ancient original culture of China, as influenced and modified by religious and artistic currents coming from India from the third century A. D. onward, are well represented.

Mushrooms Should Be Divorced from Steak

Beefsteak and mushrooms, a combination since time immemorial, should be divorced and become competitors, Louise Rice urges in Woman's Home Companion. Mushrooms she declares, are the only satisfactory substitute for beefsteak and should be used to take the place of meat on the family menu.

"It is just as hearty a dish," continues Miss Rice, "just as filling just as tasty. Used in this way not as an adjunct to meat, it is expensive." She recommends buying at least two pounds of mushrooms at a time and canning what are used, as an economy measure. Her first suggestion is stuffing the large mushrooms with bread crumbs, garlic, onion and summer savory and broiling them in chopped bacon and filling by broiling them.

Creamed mushrooms; mushroom potpie made with the stock of lamb at less than a cent a dish; mushrooms with lima beans on toast are another uses suggested by Miss Rice. She advised buying the brown, colored, mushrooms of irregular shape at the markets rather than the smooth, white ones which are the house variety and lack the flavor of the woods. Mushrooms should not be washed, she adds, but peeled instead, thus preserving the original taste.
