NO INCREASE IN MILK PRICE NOW

Dealers Fail to Agree on Plan and Consumer Profits for the Present

Due to the lack of harmony among dealers, who disagreed on plans to increase the price of milk, there will be no new price effective for October and possibly for some months, according to the Waukegan Sun, which says:

"The dealers, for the most part, agreed that a raise was necessary, but they differed as to where the additional revenue should be sought, it is understood.

"The tentative plan called for a cent more a quart to the consumer, or the same as the Chicago scale, and in increase to the merchants. Failure to reach an agreement on the increase to the merchants was given as one of the several conferences of dealers.

"The scale, effective now, is 13 cents a quart, 8 cents a pint, 16 cents a half pint for cream to the house and 11 cents a quart on milk, 7 cents a pint, and 14 cents for cream to the merchant.

Profit Margin Narrow

"Dealers claim that the margin of profit has been trimmed down to a point where the income on the basis of investment is exceedingly small. They have paid three increases to the producers without additional charge to the public, they point out.

"After the last increase was given the farmers in September the dealers agreed that a portion of the additional cost would have to be borne by the public. Following that they went into several conferences, in which they failed to reach any definite agreement."

MASONS PLAN GOLF CLUB IN LAKE CO.

Fraternity in Northern Illinois Considering Country Club Project

Announced plans of the Masonic fraternity to purchase a 200-acre tract on Fox river, just north of Fox lake, as the site of an exclusive Masonic Country club, received an enthusiastic endorsement from representative of Masonic lodges in various parts of Lake county and Kenosha, when they met with members of Waukegan Lodge No. 78, A. F. and A. M., at Masonic temple last week.

Details were discussed freely and it finally was decided to put the proposition up to the various lodges in the district in order that an expression can be obtained from the entire membership. Each lodge will form its own active committee and all will work toward the final culmination of plans.

Generally Favored

Judging by the expressions heard at the meeting there is no doubt that the plan will be put into effect. The actual purchase of the property, however, will not occur until the various lodges are ready to act as a unit.

The purchase of the land, which has a frontage of 2,000 feet on Fox river, together with the erection of a club house and the digging of an 800-foot boat canal, will cost approximately \$200,000.

Membership will be restricted to Masons only. Each membership not only provides for joint ownership of the property and club house, but carries with it title to a lot on which a member can erect a cottage.

Experts who have gone over the property carefully assert it possesses all the facilities required of a first-class golf course. Under the proposed plans a nine-hole course would be laid out at first, followed later by an eighteen-hole course.

Tips For Motorists

Look at the water that comes from the radiator when you drain it. If oil is present it indicates a leak between the compression chamber and the water jacket. In addition to loss of power, this may result in the blow-out of a cylinder head gasket.

Keep an eye on your fan belt and water pump. Unless they are in good condition and properly adjusted, your engine will not cool satisfactorily.

If you run out of gas on the road, sediment may be sucked into the feed line from the bottom of the tank. This will prevent a free flow of fuel to the motor when you fill the tank again. The engine will sputter and miss. In such a case, try to struggle to the top of a hill and coast down the other side with the ignition on. In all probability, the feed line will be sucked clear of dirt and the motor will run smoothly thereafter.
