## Chicago's Product of Men's Clothing Large

Chicago may not be the biggest manufacturing center of men's clothing, as far as quantity goes, but it leads the world in production of male toggerly of the quality type.

Chicago supplies \$275,000,000 worth of men's garb annually, says the Chicago Association of Commerce. But of the clothing business alone, custom tailors do an annual business of \$27,000,000 or more than one-third of the volume of the ready-to-wear outlets.

There are 3,046 retail outlets, with thirty-three department stores selling \$18,500,000 worth of men's and boys' clothing annually. And they sell \$15,731,400 more in furnishings.
