

### Relatives of Missing

The Adjusted Compensation Act was amended on May 29, 1928, allowing wives, children, mother and father the benefits of Federal Adjusted Compensation where the veteran has been missing for seven years or more. The final date for making a claim under this act is January 1, 1930.

The Comptroller General in a decision released August 28, 1929, holds that the claims for benefits of this act must be made by the next of kin, before the expiration of the sevenyear period since the disappearance of the veteran. Claims actually submitted after the expiration of the seven-year period are not payable according to the decision.
