Harold Bloomfield, who attends the University of Illinois, spent the weekend with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Bloomfield.

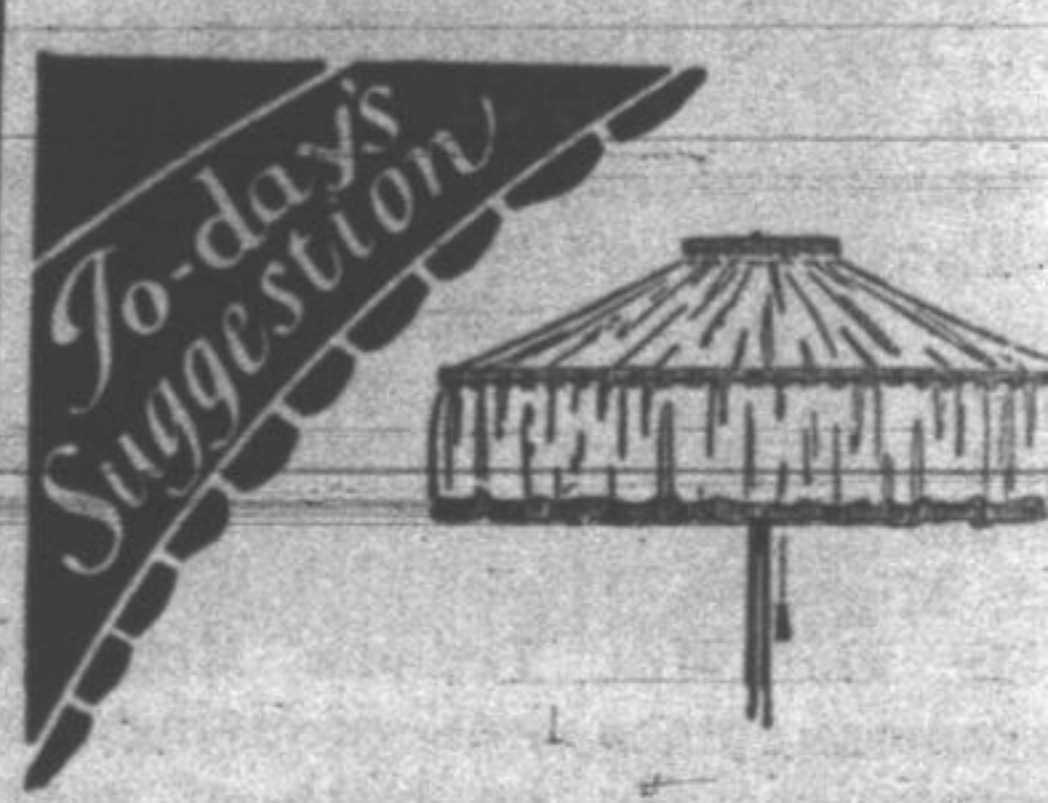
