How to Get Same Auto License for Next Year

Illinois car owners who desire same state license number for as they carry this year should their application for it so that reaches the secretary of state before December 1, the Chicago Motor points out.

Illinois' motor vehicle law makes provision for each motorist to receive the same number if he seeks the motor club explained. Section which contains that provision, reads in part: "The secretary of state Illinois shall not thereafter assign a number, once assigned, to a motor vehicle owned by any other person if the owner of the motor vehicle whom such number was first assigned shall, not less than thirty days prior to the day of expiration of said registration, file an application, accompanied by the fees therein specified for the registration or re-registration of a motor vehicle, and request assignment of said number to a motor vehicle owned by him."

The application blanks for state licenses are expected to be available on or about November
