Former Great Lakes Lieutenant Charged With Embezzlement

Lieut. Charles "Charlie" Muesel, who was stationed on Great Lakes during the war but who made his home in Waukegan for almost four years, recently admitted the embezzlement of \$50,000 from the naval paymaster's department at Hampton roads, Va., according to a report.

Lieut. Muesel was charged with the embezzlement after an investigation had been completed. Since then he has restored \$48,939 of the amount, according to his story, and intends to get the remainder from relatives. He hoped by making complete restitution that he will be able to get out of a jail sentence. In any event he would have to resign his commission.

Muesel was a chief petty officer at Great Lakes station when the war came. He gained the rank of lieutenant in a few months after the recruits began pouring into the service. While at the station he wedded a Waukegan woman.

Two Men Sentenced Admitted to Prison

Carmine Battino, sentenced to from one to 10 years for larceny, and Albert Mihan, from one to 14 years for manslaughter, last week were admitted to Joliet penitentiary after a delay due to the failure to take a mittimus, it was learned today from Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle. 
