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grounds. In order that your grounds be laid out to their greatest advantage, it is necessary to go through step by step each stage of development.

First—Save all the good soil on the entire place. If the grade line of the entire place must be changed, every bit of soil must be piled and saved for that purpose.

Second—Drives and walks properly designed and laid out mean everything to the landscape of a home. Avoid straight lines as much as possible. Have the drive sunken from four to six inches when completed, unless a ribbon or concrete drive is constructed.

Third—Correct grading is where more than half the real value is in a properly landscaped home. First it is necessary to design the lay of the grounds before the rough grade is made, as all beds where plantings are to be made be excavated six to twelve inches deep, so that when the top dressing is to be applied the places where the beds are located will be all ready to receive the plants.

Manure and bone-meal, Limestone and in some cases other fertilizers should be applied freely over the rough grade before the top soil is applied. If these preliminary details are not taken care of and failure of plants to properly develop on your lawn has been a sad disappointment, your efforts to have a well landscaped home are ruined, or at least very costly to acquire.
