Finds Clue to Car Which Killed Youth

After an investigation of almost two weeks, Marshal J. Riggs of Fox Lake uncovered a clue in the vampire auto death of Herman Lauesen, the 18 year old Chicago youth who was found dead on Route 59 near Ingleside, early on October 27, which may lead to the apprehension of the driver.

Several bits of glass from the death auto were picked up in the road. These proved to have come from a Willys-Knight of recent manufacture, and the police of Lake county and Chicago have been enlisted in the search for such an auto-whose windshield and headlights were broken lately.

Lauesen, the auto victim, was found lifeless at the side of the road, a few minutes after he had been struck by the speeding auto. He had evidently died instantly from a badly

fractured skull and several other fractures.

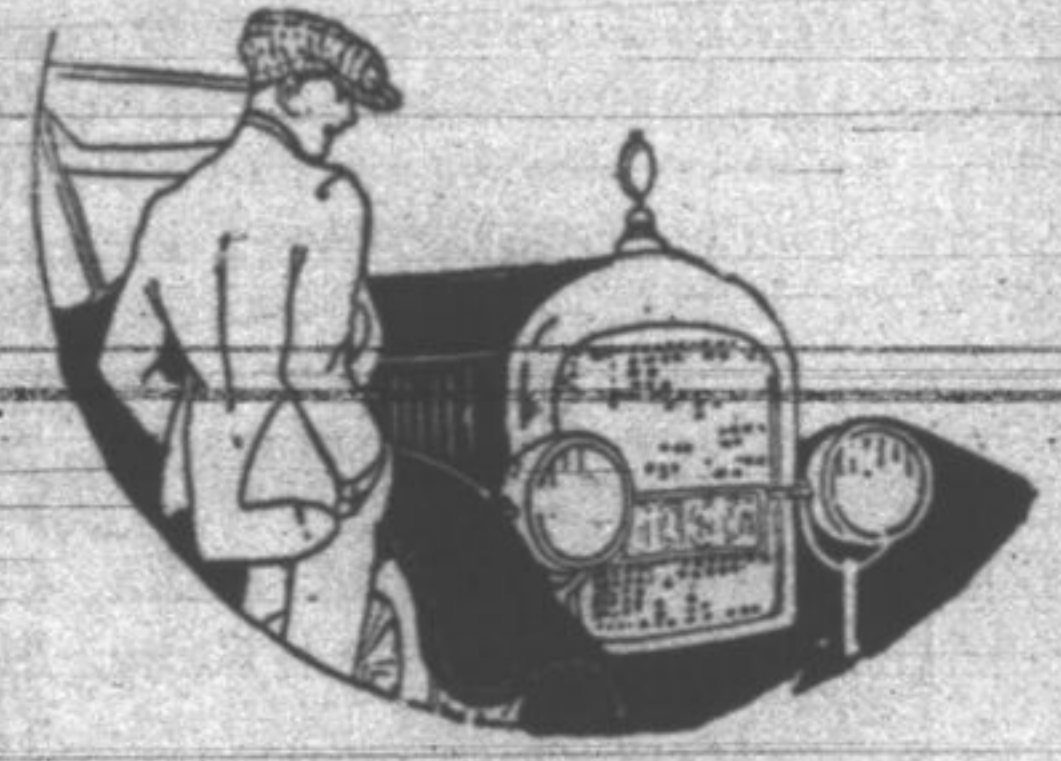
He had left his home at 5451 Ravenswood avenue in Chicago, at about midnight, to shoot ducks at Fox Lake, and he was last seen alive by Joseph Tanel, proprietor of a garage at Riverside, who had passed him walking toward Fox Lake, 15 minutes before he was found dead.
