

Time to Have Auto Preparations Due

The time has come for motorists to take their cars to the service station of dealers and have them prepared for winter driving.

Incidentally, these are the things which the service mechanics check when cars are brought in. The items follow:

Grease and oil for the engine, transmission and rear axle should be changed to meet cold weather re-

quirements. The expense is negligible when compared to the reduced wear and the prolonged life of these vital units.

A supply of anti-freeze mixture should be laid in, even though not used immediately, so that the first cold snap will not catch the owner unprepared.

The owner should install a radiator shutter, either using the one he has or purchasing one.

For purposes of warmth and comfort in winter driving, a heater should be placed in the car.

The battery should be recharged and filled with the proper water and solution. The battery must be kept to full efficiency in winter when more power is required in turning over the motor.

The cooling system should be cleaned out and water jacket gaskets and hose connections tightened or replaced.

Brakes should be adjusted.

The fuel system should be cleaned out.

Ignition should be checked, including points, coil and timing.

Fort Sheridan May Be Affected by Slashing of U. S. Appropriations

Fort Sheridan authorities are watching with considerable interest the developments at the White House congress and at the war department in Washington, D. C., which developments foretell a bitter parliamentary engagement over military expenditures during the regular session congress.

Recommendations contained in a general staff report on possible trenchment are expected to emphasize the disagreement in congress. Its far reaching economy proposal is believed to be that several existing army posts be abandoned. The congressional repercussion to that will be quick and emphatic on the part of representatives in whose districts posts are situated.

Fort Sheridan's Importance Highlighted

Among the posts in the middle west mentioned some time ago in the proposal for abandonment by the government is Fort Sheridan. Any attempt to have this reservation cut from a list of army posts would meet with considerable opposition on the part of political authorities in this section. It is claimed. The importance of having the post in this important territory has been stressed from time to time and its value in case of emergency has been brought to the forefront in many arguments.

Other posts mentioned are Fort Robinson, Neb., Fort Lincoln, S. D., and Jefferson Barracks, Mo.
