

Says Spouse Tried to Drown Her in Bathtub

Mrs. Jean McFarlane of Grayslake, a wife of almost eight years, last week filed suit for divorce in the circuit court charging her husband, Andrew, with cruelty and excessive drinking.

Mrs. McFarlane charged that on one occasion her husband held her in the bath tub and tried to drown

her. Another time, according to the bill, which was filed by Attorney R. W. Churchill, McFarlane threatened her life with a razor blade.

During the past two years he drank excessively, according to the bill, which resulted in intoxicated conditions that always marked extreme cruelty on his part, the bill stated.

The wife asked the custody of the two small children.

Man Caught Here Is Identified As Yegg Who Shot Detective

Arthur Reid in the custody of Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle for his part in the attempted robbery of a South box-car at Lake Villa, was definitely identified last week as the man shot and seriously wounded Special Agent Fairweather of the C. & N. railroad at Rochelle, Ill., in July. Fairweather called at the jail to and recognized Reid at once. Reid was picked up at Deersfield shortly after the shooting at Lake Villa and taken to the Highland Park hospital where his wound was treated. Later he was taken to the county jail.

Detectives from several other roads in the Chicago area came to the jail this morning to grill Reid further regarding other box-car robberies which have occurred during the past year in this vicinity. They could gain no further admissions from him.

Detective Fairweather, after sizing up Reid, stated that Reid shot him twice when he attempted to interfere with the robbery of a car full of tubs of butter. Reid wounded Fairweather but the detective managed to wound Reid's companion when Reid was making an escape.

Sheriff Doolittle expects that Reid will be removed from the county jail shortly. The railroad detectives have not as yet decided whether they will turn Reid over to the federal authorities or force him to complete a former sentence from which he escaped at the Jackson, Mich., penitentiary.

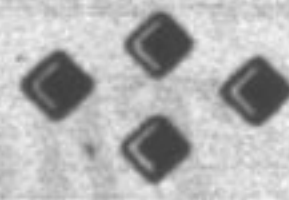
