### Palliere's Humanity, Outstanding Trait, Is Evidenced in Address

It would be a splendid thing if every Christian and Jew in America might hear the stirring appeal for breadth of vision, tolerance of spirit and sincere dedication to the reality of true religion which is made by Monsieur Aimé Pallière of Paris, who spoke before a large audience at North Shore Congregation Israel in Glencoe last Friday night.

Monsieur Pallière, in the words of Rabbi Kopald, is the type of religionist which all of us should be and in a sense aspire to be—the type of religionist who is above all organized religions and who is a humanist dedicated only to the cause of brotherhood among men.

Though Pallière has formally identified himself with Judaism, the beauties and the validities of Catholicism, in which he was born, are neither dimmed nor lost to him. He stands out as a giant figure whose life and service are devoted to the cause of tolerance, good will and brotherhood between Christian and Jew. His address at the Temple was a ringing loyal to the fundamental realities of Christianity and to the Jew to remain loyal to his own high spiritual heritage.
