

## LAKE COUNTY TOTAL ASSESSED VALUATION

Is Placed at Over \$105,000,000, Increase Over Last Year; Township Lists

The total assessed valuation of Lake county this year is \$105,118,395, an increase of \$2,677,010 over the total in 1928, according to the final report of the board of review which finished its work today. The total last year was \$10,441,385, the personal being \$15,610,030 and the real estate, \$86,831,355.

The increase this year is noted mainly in the real estate valuations which are listed at \$89,804,845. The personal values are shown at \$15,313,550, a decrease of \$296,480.

Values in Waukegan township this year increased both in real and personal values, the exact increase being 565,665. The personal is listed at \$4,373,515 and the real estate at \$22,818,660.

The total value of the insurance premiums being paid on in the county is listed at \$98,710. This is on fire insurance alone.
