Alice Boines, colored serving maid, employed in Highland Park, was the person in whose name the license had been obtained for the car used by two Chicago negroes Sunday morning in a daring holdup at Glencoe, Chief of Police Moroney reports.

When questioned by Chief Moroney, however, the Boines woman denied any connection with the holdup. She admitted knowing that the license had been issued in her name but stated she was not the owner of the car, the police state. They are continuing the investigation.

Not in Hold-Up

She convinced police that she was not connected with the holdup and that she had not given information concerning north shore homes to confederates.
