

### In Illinois Last Year 48 Persons Attained Age of Hundred Years

Forty-eight Illinois residents lived to be more than 100 years old last year, according to an analysis of state mortality statistics by Dr. Andy Hall, director of the state department of health here today.

Hall declared that the figures revealed that approximately one person out of a hundred has a chance to arrive at the ripe old age of 90, that that ratio for celebrating an eightieth birthday is nearly one out of ten and that chances of reaching the proverbial three score years and ten, is about one out of three.

More persons than ever are reaching their seventieth birthday, according to Hall, who attributes it to improved living conditions.

Mortality among the younger age groups predominates in the males, Hall said. Of the 90,192 deaths in the state last year, he declared 23,709 had passed 70, while 8,333 were less than one year old. Women, the statistics showed, live longer than men.

Of the 1,195 who reached the ninety mark, 770 were women, of 7,764 who lived beyond four score years, 4,088 were women.

"The data indicates quite clearly that the life span has not been stretched one day at the nether end of the ladder," said Dr. Hall.
