1929, was ordered placed on file.

**For Shore Protection**

Commissioner Gourley moved the passage of an ordinance providing for the protection of the waterworks of the City of Highland Park and authorizing the city clerk to advertise for bids for the construction of protection according to certain specifications. The ordinance as read will remain on file for public inspection as required by law. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Zimmer moved that the estimate in favor of Peter H. Grimson in the amount of \$5,200 for lathing and plastering under his contract on the new city hall building be approved and voucher issued in payment of same. The motion prevailed.

**Division of Assessment**

Commissioner Gourley moved that the property owners' petition for the division of special assessment levied against lots 31 and 32, Hovland's first addition for the construction of a connected system of water mains in Sunset Woods subdivision, etc., under Warrant No. 306, be accepted and that the corporation council be instructed to present said petition to the County court for approval. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Zimmer moved that the property owner's petition for the division of special assessment levied against (ex. N 20A), S. ¼, W. ½, S. W. ¼, Sections 21, 43, 12, for the construction of a connected system of water mains in Hovland's Highland Park Acres, etc., under Warrant No. 325, be accepted and that the corporation council be instructed to present said petition to the County court for approval. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Gourley moved that the city clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for electrical fixtures and certain flooring in connection with the new city hall building in ac-

cordance with the plans of Frederick Hodgdon, said bids to be received by the council in open session on Monday, December 23, 1929, at 7:30 o'clock. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Zimmer moved that an ordinance entitled: "An ordinance amending an ordinance regulating the operation of taxi-cabs and fixing the location of taxi-cab stands in the city of Highland Park. The chief change made is a reduction in

license fees. The ordinance, under the motion, was placed on file for public inspection complete in form for one week before its final passage, the motion having prevailed.

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
