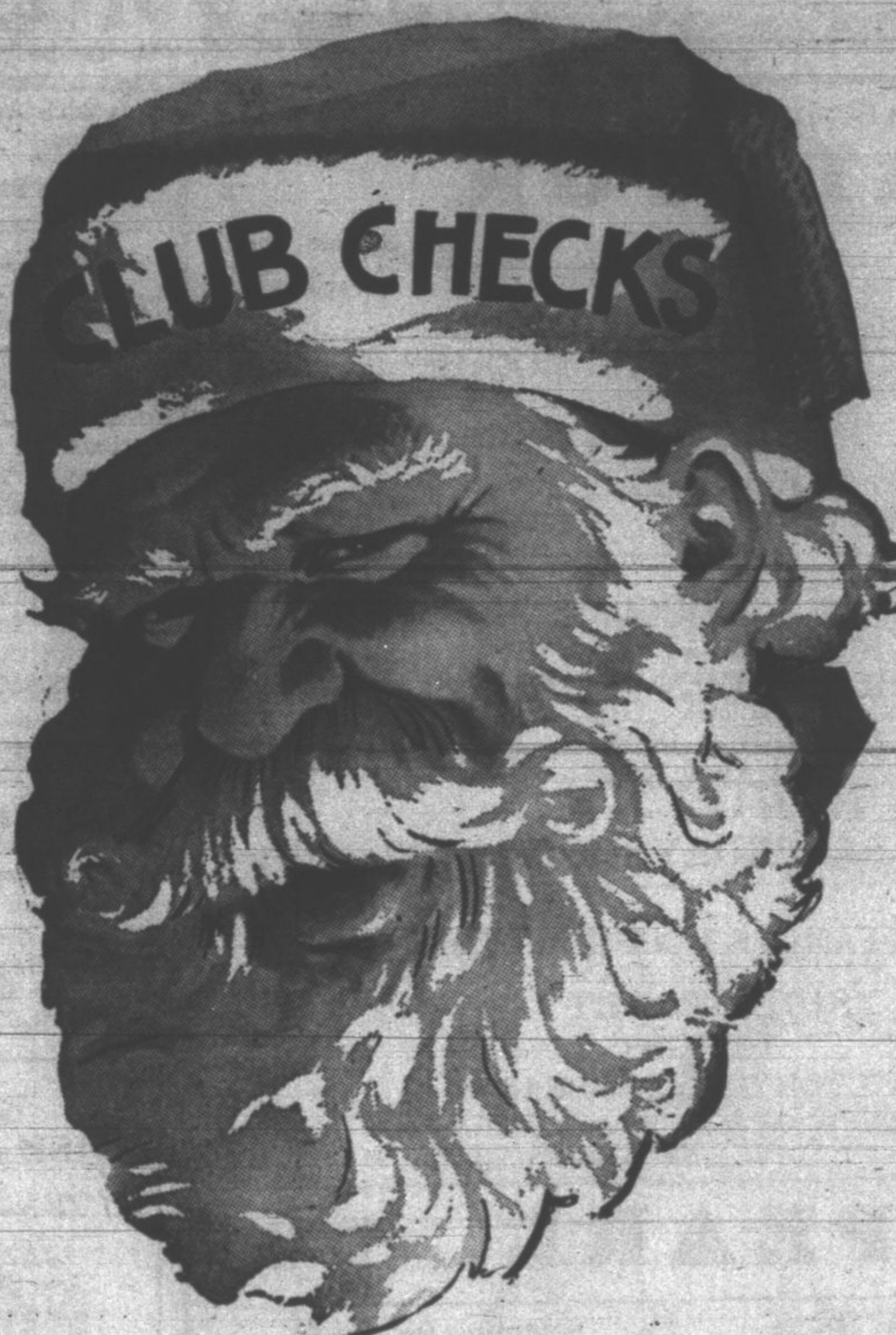
The proceeds will be used to carry on the many activities of the sisterhood. Mrs. B. S. Goodman of Glen-
